



Gösta Blücher

Gösta Blücher is born 1936. He is an architect, graduated from the Royal Institute of Technology – KTH – in Stockholm 1960 and from the Nordic Institute of planning – Nordplan – in 1971. He has worked as town planning architect in Nacka (1961-1969) and as head of the urban planning department at the National board for planning and building – Planverket – (1969-1982). He has been an expert adviser to the minister of Housing (1982-1988) and Director general of the National board for housing, building and planning – Boverket (1988-1998). He is since 1999 adjunct professor in spatial planning at the Blekinge Institute of Technology – BTH.

He was directly reporting to the minister when leading the development of the new Planning and Building Act – PBL – and then chairing the organization for education of officials in municipalities and in state authorities. He also chaired the commission for education on the new Environmental Code in 1998-1999. He has participated in several commissions on national and international level (ECE, OECD). He is Honorary member of the Swedish Society for Town and Country Planning. He has been a board member of IFHP and also chairman of the Swedish structure of European.
